## Agmentation finds solutions for communites

Whilst agricultural production is vulnerable, so too are our small rural towns with devastating consequences for health, trade, sport, investment, education - it impacts every part of our lives. The 2022 Agmentation - supported by the SQNNSW Innovation Hub - brought together 10 teams and more than 80 people to prepare and pitch solutions to one of three problems: how to identify tools that add value



to farm businesses to increase resilience, how to design communities to prepare for climate variability, and how to protect biodiversity.

## Quick bites from your Hub stakeholders

#### Do you have a farm biosecurity plan?

The best defence against pests and diseases is to implement sound biosecurity practices on your farm. Quick and simple measures built into everyday practice will help protect your farm and your future. Find the <u>Farm Biosecurity Action Planner here</u>. In NSW, expert staff from Local Land Services (LLS) will connect with farmers through a series of targeted workshops, webinars, and visits to saleyards and field days to help farmers identify and report the early signs of both FMD and Lumpy Skin Disease (LSD). <u>Read more</u>.

#### New variable rainfall maps

Long Paddock's rainfall poster maps have been updated. The maps show data from April 2021 to March 2022 in comparison to each year as far back as 1890. <u>Check out the new posters</u> for rainfall, tropical cyclone, pasture growth, and wet and dry periods. These resources are delivered by the Queensland Government's Drought and Climate Adaptation Program.

#### Value of agriculture increases

The value of Australian agriculture is increasing, despite the challenges of COVID-19, droughts, floods and labour issues, the latest Agricultural Census has shown. According to the Australian Bureau of Statistics, the gross value of production increased 17% in 2020/21. <u>Read more</u>.

#### Varroa compensation for beekeepers

An \$18 million compensation package has been developed for registered beekeepers affected by the varroa mite outbreak, under an agreement reached by governments and industry. Federal Minister for Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry Murray Watt said the agreement meant registered commercial beekeepers would be reimbursed for all equipment, hives and bees destroyed in the eradication process, as well as the costs of honey. <u>Read more</u>. And Hort Innovation is funding work into a world-first hormone-based <u>varroa-targeting pesticide</u>.

#### Sustainability investment ramps up solar PV adoption

AMPC's free service to help members with initial assessment and design of new solar PV systems or to check their existing systems performance has proven to be successful with new solar PV projects equalling 40% of installed capacity across the industry. <u>Read more</u>.
